CWP No.21897 of 2016

Feeling aggrieved against the issuance of labour licence in favour
of respondent No.4 namely Gaurav Kumar qua HTC, Jind as new contractor
from 20.09.2016 to 19.09.2016, vide Annexure P-2 dated 12.07.2016, petitioner
has approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article
226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of certiorari,
for quashing the impugned order as well as a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, at the very outset, fairly states
that he does not intend to press this petition for a writ in the nature of certiorari,

for the time being. He further submits that given an opportunity, petitioner shall approach District Manager, Food Corporation of India, Rohtak-respondent No.3, by moving an appropriate representation highlighting his grievance against the impugned communications dated 12.07.2016 (Annexure P-2) and 31.08.2016 (Annexure P-3) within a period of two weeks from today and he may be directed to consider and decide the same at an early date.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, present writ petition is disposed of, with a direction to District Manager, Food Corporation of India, Rohtak-respondent No.3 that if the petitioner approaches him by moving an appropriate representation within a period of two weeks from today, he shall consider the grievance raised by the petitioner and shall pass an appropriate order at an early date, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of six weeks after the receipt of representation from the petitioner.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, instant writ petition stands disposed of.
