This order shall dispose of bunch of Writ Petitions
Nos.5644 of 2012; 10364, 10375, 14284 of 2014; 6950, 10129, 10169,
16205, 16257, 16408, 16410, 17170, 17915, 19487, 20420, 20460, 20471,
20745, 20749, 23599, 23670, 24317, 24320, 24369, 24373, 26519, 26554 of
2015 and 614 of 2016.

The petitioners herein claimed that they are manufacturers of certain bioproducts which do not fall within the definition of Insecticide as contained in the Insecticides Act, 1968, hence, they do not require any permissions to market the same. However, the State is not granting any No Objection Certificate.

Learned counsel for the parties do not dispute that on agreed terms, vide order of even date a bunch of petitions bearing CWP No.12536 of 2011, titled as **M/s Biostadt India Ltd. Vs. State of Haryana and others** and others have been disposed of with certain directions for dealing with the cases for grant of permission by the State for marketing of bioproducts.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that they will follow the same procedure for seeking permission from the competent authority in these cases.

Learned counsel for the respondents do not have any objection.

Accordingly, the present petitions are disposed of permitting the petitioners herein to seek permission in terms of the detailed order passed today in **M/s Biostadt India Ltd.'s case (supra)**.
