Present writ petition is directed against the order dated 31.03.2016 (Annexure P-7) passed by the learned Permanent Lok Adalat, Public Utility Services, Ambala, Camp Court at Kaithal-respondent No.2.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioners.

When confronted with the order dated 11.08.2016 passed by this Court in **CWP No.7585 of 2015 (Jagdish Vs. State of Haryana and others)** interpreting the provisions of this very scheme known as Rajiv Gandhi Pariwar Bima Yojana, learned counsel for the petitioners had no answer and rightly so, it being a matter of record.

In fact, such a petition ought not to have been filed at all by the petitioner-Department, because the impugned order is not only a just order on merits of the case but is also in consonance with the order passed by this Court in **Jagdish's** case (supra).

Learned counsel for the petitioners could not address any

meaningful arguments, which may warrant interference at the hands of this Court, while exercising its writ jurisdiction under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India.

Considering the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case noted above, coupled with the reasons aforementioned, this Court is of the considered view that since the impugned order passed by learned Permanent Lok Adalat has been found a well reasoned order, causing no prejudice, of any kind whatsoever, to the petitioners, instant writ petition has been found wholly misconceived, bereft of merit and without any substance, thus, it must fail. No case for interference has been made out.

Resultantly, with the abovesaid observations made, instant writ petition stands dismissed, however, with no order as to costs.
