The OMR sheet has been produced in Court and opened by the Court Secretary for the perusal of the parties. The petitioner's assertion in response to question No.16 is that while responding to the said question a drop of water accidentally fell on the OMR Sheet, to wit, on answer 'D' which was the correct answer but he chose to respond to 'B' which was the wrong answer, is highly improbable and not the correct version. To the naked eye there is neither smudging nor smearing on the disputed spot. The bubble at 'D' is rough to the touch to leave no manner of doubt that something foreign has caused the embossing, which water could not have achieved.

This placates Mr. Sharma after holding the OMR sheet in his hand and seeing for himself that there was no truth in the story told by his client to obtain relief and therefore nothing further remains to be examined or decided since the OMR sheet speaks for itself. The same is returned to the learned Law Officer for return to proper custody.

The petition is dismissed.
