Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioners have approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that when the genuine grievance of the petitioners was not being redressed, they finally approached the respondent authorities by way of self-contained representation dated 27.09.2014 (Annexure P-3), which was forwarded vide letter dated 09.12.2014 (Annexure P-4) to Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana-respondent No.2 but the same is also pending decision. He further submits that petitioners will be satisfied in case respondent No.2 is directed to consider and decide the representation of the petitioners within a reasonable time by passing an appropriate order thereon.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and without

expressing any opinion on merits of the case, Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana-respondent No.2 is directed to look into the matter, consider the grievance raised by the petitioners vide their representation dated 27.09.2014 (Annexure P-3) and decide the same at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, instant writ petition stands disposed of.
