After arguing the case for some time, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that he does not intend to press this writ petition for the writ in the nature of certiorari, for the time being. He further submits that given an opportunity, petitioners shall move an appropriate and comprehensive representation before respondent No.2, within a period of three weeks from today by making an appropriate prayer therein and respondent No.2 may be directed to pass an appropriate order thereon, within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the present writ petition is

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disposed of, with a direction to the Punjab State Commission for Women-respondent No.2 that if the petitioners approach him, by moving an appropriate comprehensive representation within a period of three weeks from today by making appropriate prayer therein, the same shall be considered and decided by passing an appropriate order thereon, after granting due opportunity of being heard to all the parties concerned, in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of three months from the date of receipt of representation from the petitioners.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the instant writ petition stands disposed of.
