Feeling aggrieved against the less allocation of paddy to the petitioner to the tune of 3327 MT of paddy for the purpose of milling, vide Annexure P-1, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of certiorari as well as for a writ in the nature of mandamus, directing the respondent authorities to reconsider their decision and raise the quantity of allotment of paddy in favour of the petitioner, for which it is entitled in law.

After arguing the case for some time, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he does not intend to press the present writ petition for a writ in the nature of certiorari, for the time being. He further submits that raising its grievance, petitioner had already approached the respondent authorities by way of its legal notice dated 15.10.2016 (Annexure P-4) but the same is also pending decision. He also submits that petitioner will be satisfied

in case respondent No.3 is directed to consider the grievance of the petitioner and pass an appropriate order on its legal notice, at an early date.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner at some length and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, present writ petition is disposed of, with a direction to Managing Director, Punjab State Cooperative Supply & Marketing Federation Ltd. (Markfed)-respondent No.3 to look into the matter, consider the grievance of the petitioner raised in legal notice dated 15.10.2016 (Annexure P-4) and decide the same at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, instant writ petition stands disposed of.
