Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

After hearing the learned counsel for the petitioner, petitioner has has not been found having any locus standi to file and maintain the present writ petition. It seems that petitioner is trying to settle his personal score, being the former Sarpanch. Learned counsel for the petitioner could not substantiate any of his contentions raised.
