Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner places reliance on an order dated 25.04.2016 passed by this Court in CWP No.6105 of 2016 (Rakesh Chander Basil Ram Kapoor @ Rakesh Kapoor and another Vs. Union of India and another), to contend that let a similar order be passed in the instant case, which will satisfy the petitioner.

The abovesaid prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioner has not been opposed by learned counsel for the respondents as well.

In view of the above, instant writ petition is disposed of, with a direction to the respondents that in case the petitioner submits the documents as per the checklist produced by learned counsel for the respondents before this

Court, respondent No.1 shall decide the issue in regard to issuance of passport to the petitioner, by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of three weeks from the date of submission of documents by the petitioner.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, instant writ petition stands disposed of.
