RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (ORAL)

Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, at the very outset, fairly states that since the petitioner is seeking only a writ in the nature of mandamus, but she did not approach the concerned authorities by moving an appropriate representation or legal notice, before filing the present writ petition. He submits that given an opportunity, petitioner shall approach the Commissioner of Police, Ludhiana-respondent No.3 within a period of two weeks from today, by moving an appropriate representation and he may be directed to consider the grievance of the petitioner and decide the matter at an early date, in accordance with law.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights

of either of the parties, present writ petition is disposed of, with a direction to Commissioner of Police, Ludhiana-respondent No.3 that if the petitioner approaches him, by moving an appropriate representation within a period of two weeks from today, he shall consider the grievance of the petitioner and decide the same at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of representation from the petitioner.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, instant writ petition stands disposed of.
