Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioners have approached this Court, by way of instant writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of Mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that in compliance of the remand order dated 19.11.2015 (Annexure P-1) passed by the competent authority, petitioners put appearance before Sub Divisional Magistrate(civil)-cum-Collector, Agrarian-cum-Allotment Authority, Jagadhri, District Yamuna Nagar-respondent No.3 on 23.12.2015. However, despite the lapse of a period of about one year, no proceeding has taken place so far and the matter is being delayed unnecessarily by respondent No.3. He further submits that petitioners will be satisfied in case the Sub Divisional Magistrate(civil)-cum-Collector, Agrarian-cum-Allotment Authority, Jagadhri, District Yamuna Nagar-respondent No.3 is directed to

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pass an appropriate order in strict compliance of the remand order dated 19.11.2015 (Annexure P-1), within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, present writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the Sub Divisional Magistrate(civil)-cum-Collector, Agrarian-cum-Allotment Authority, Jagadhri, District Yamuna Nagar-respondent No.3 to look into the matter, consider the remand order dated 19.11.2015 (Annexure P-1), grant an opportunity of being heard to all the concerned parties and thereafter, pass an appropriate order, at an early date, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, present petition stands disposed of.
