Instant writ petition is directed against the policy decision dated 26.11.2015 (Annexure P-8) issued by the competent authority of respondent-Department, Union of India, seeking a writ in the nature of certiorari, for quashing the impugned policy decision.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner.

The petitioner has already filed Civil Suit No.58694 of 2016, seeking exactly the same relief. The Civil Suit is pending before the learned Court of competent jurisdiction at Delhi for 17.01.2017, as per Annexure P-9.

In view of the abovesaid undisputed fact situation obtaining on the record and as per own showing of the petitioner, coupled with the fact that since framing of policy would be exclusive domain of the executive, no ground for interference at the hands of this Court, at this stage of the litigation, is made out.

In view of the above, present writ petition is dismissed with liberty to the petitioner to pursue her remedy of Civil Suit, which she is already rightly pursuing. It also goes without saying that the respondent authorities shall be bound by the directions issued by the learned Court of competent jurisdiction in the abovesaid Civil Suit.

Disposed of, accordingly.
