Feeling aggrieved against the impugned order dated 11.8.2015 (Annexure P-7), petitioner has approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of certiorari, for quashing the impugned order.

Notice of motion was issued and in compliance thereof, written statement was filed.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Manmohan Singh, Police Station, Nabha, District Patiala, submits that cancellation report, presented by the investigating agency in FIR No.68 dated 25.5.2009 registered at Police Station Nabha, has been accepted by the learned court of competent jurisdiction vide order dated 10.9.2016. Nothing adverse is against the petitioner qua FIR No.68 dated 25.5.2009.

In this view of the matter, Station House Officer, Police Station, Sadar Nabha, District Patiala-respondent No.3 is directed to furnish a fresh police report to the Regional Passport Officer, Chandigarh-respondent No.2, within a period of four weeks from today. After receipt of fresh police report by respondent No.3, respondent No.2 shall proceed further, in accordance with law, taking an appropriate action within four weeks thereafter and the matter shall be disposed of, accordingly.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the instant writ petition stands disposed of.
