1.) In the instant writ petition, the petitioner has questioned the order vide Annexure P-4 by which her candidature is held to be ineligible. The petitioner is candidate for recruitment to the post of Social Education Mistress. Mode of selection reads as under:-

3. Mode of Selection:-

The candidates who have passed Punjab State Teacher Eligibility Test-2 (P.S.T.E.T.-2) will be eligible for these posts. For filling of these posts a State Level written test of 150 marks will be conducted in the concerned subject. The candidate who have secured 75 marks will be considered to have passed this test. The (S.C., S.T., O.B.C., B.C. And handicapped candidate will be granted relaxation of 5% i.e. 8 marks) and also fulfil other terms and conditions prescribed in the advertisement against these posts i.e. education/professional qualification, the merit of the candidate will be prepared by calculating the mark obtained in the written examination in the concerned subject and marks obtained in Punjab State Eligibility

Test-II. (If more than one candidate obtained equal marks by adding marks obtained in Punjab State Teachers Eligibility Test-2 (P.S.T.E.T-2) and from written test then the candidate who is elder in age he will be kept first in the merit, if more than one candidate have equal marks and age then the candidate who have obtained excess percentage in graduation, he will be kept first in merit)."

2.) Having regard to the mode of selection, the petitioner who is a candidate and she has secured 86 marks in the TET Examination, whereas respondent-selecting authority have considered the candidature of the petitioner with reference to mode of selection. In the mode of selection, the merit of the candidate will be prepared by calculating the marks obtained in the written examination in the concerned subject and marks obtained in the Punjab State Eligibility Test-II. Admittedly, the petitioner has secured 86 marks in the TET Test and the persons who were selected in the ESM (General) category have secured 90 marks. The petitioner has secured marks less than the last candidate. Therefore, there is no infirmity with the remarks that "TET MARKS LESS THAN 90" against petitioner's name vide Annexure P-4. The petitioner has not made out a case so as to interfere with Annexure P-4.

3.) Petition stands dismissed.
