Petitioner seeks the benefit of counting of the previous service rendered by him in the Punjab State Hosiery & Knitwear Corporation, for the purpose of pensionary and other retiral benefits.

In the additional affidavit dated 31.05.2016, filed today, of Shri Hem Raj Goyal, Joint Director, Local Fund Accounts, Punjab, it has been averred as under:

“2. That it is respectfully submitted that the matter regarding counting of past service for grant of pension and other pensionary benefits was under the consideration of the State Government. It is further submitted that now Government of Punjab, Department of Finance (Finance Pension Policy and Coordination Branch) has taken a policy decision in this matter and has conveyed the same vide letter no. 4/90/2010-1FPPC/734820/1 dated 18.04.2016 and the copy of the same is annexed as Annexure R-1.

3. That as per the policy decision of the Government of Punjab, Department of Finance vide letter No.4/90/2010-1FPPC/734820/1 dated 18.04.2016, the petitioner has to

deposit the amount of employer's share of Contributory Provident Fund in respect of his past service alongwith 12% interest in the Government Treasury.

4. That accordingly on deposit of the employer's share of Provident Fund alongwith 12% interest by the petitioner in the Government Treasury, the past service will be counted for the purpose of pension and other pensionary benefits. There after the revised pension case of the petitioner will be sent to Accountant General, Punjab i.e. Respondent No.3 for verification of the same.”

Accordingly, in view of the undertaking given by the State, the present writ petition is disposed of. It will be open to the petitioner to avail the said benefit, after complying with the necessary formalities. The amount due be intimated to the petitioner within 4 weeks from today.
