Feeling aggrieved against the impugned orders Annexures P-10 and P-11, petitioner has approached this Court by way of present writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of Certiorari, for quashing the impugned orders. Petitioner has also sought a writ in the nature of Mandamus, directing respondent No.2 to release registration certificate and form No. 28 of bus No. HR 37A-1552 in favour of the petitioner.

Notice of motion was issued and in compliance thereof, written statements have been filed. One written statement has been filed on behalf of respondents No.2 and 3. Another written statement has been filed on behalf of respondent No.4.

Heard learned counsel for the parties.

It is no more in dispute that, during the pendency of the present writ petition, registration certificate has already been issued in favour of the petitioner, thus, the basic grievance of the petitioner stands redressed. Another submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner is that petitioner is entitled for reasonable amount of compensation from the respondents for keeping the matter pending for inordinate long period, causing huge financial loss to the petitioner.

Having heard learned counsel for the parties and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, regarding claim of compensation by the petitioner, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, present writ petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to recover the amount on account of financial loss, if any, from the respondents before appropriate forum, in accordance with law.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, present writ petition stands disposed of.
