Instant writ petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to decide the legal notice (Annexure P/6) and to award compensation to the tune of Rs. 50 lacs to the petitioners on account of untimely death of Ajay Kumar, husband of petitioner no.1, father of petitioners no.2 and 3 and son of petitioner no.4.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners and perused the record.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that petitioners have already sent a legal notice dated 16.11.2015 (Annexure P/6) for claiming compensation. Learned counsel does not press the petition on merits and prays that respondents be directed to decide legal notice dated 16.11.2015 (Annexure P/6). Learned counsel further prays that the petitioners may be permitted to submit fresh detailed legal

notice/representation.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioners and after perusing the paper-book, however, without commenting on merits of the case, instant petition is disposed of without issuing notice to the respondents, with liberty to the petitioners to move fresh legal notice/representation within 15 days from today. The respondents shall decide the legal notice (Annexure P/6)/fresh legal notice/representation that may be submitted by the petitioners, in accordance with law, preferably within a period of two months from the date of submission of fresh legal notice/representation or receipt of certified copy of this order, whichever is later and copy of the order so passed in pursuance of the instant direction shall be communicated to the counsel for the petitioners as well as the petitioners in writing.
