Petitioner has filed this petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking a writ in the nature of Certiorari for quashing the order dated 05.11.2015.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that in fact, Trilok Chand had died a natural death and no accident as alleged by respondents No.2 to 4 has taken place. Learned counsel has further submitted that specific issue in this regard was liable to be framed by the Commissioner.

The argument raised by the learned counsel for the petitioner is without any force as the petitioner would be at liberty to lead evidence to the effect that the deceased Trilok Chand had died a natural death while leading evidence qua issue No.2.

Faced with the situation, learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that he may be permitted to withdraw the petition.

Dismissed as withdrawn.
