One Surinder Kaur Anand filed an application under Section 22 (C) of the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987 [for short 'the Act'] against the petitioner and Assistant Registrar, Cooperative Societies, Derabassi, before the Permanent Lok Adalat (PUS), Roopnagar. The petitioner filed the reply to the application. Thereafter, respondent No.2, who was represented by her Advocate Mr.Sanjeev Soni, suffered a statement that she would be bound to pay any amount, which would be demanded by the society/petitioner for the welfare and development of the society even after the execution of the conveyance deed. Later on, the said Surinder Kaur Anand withdrew the application and ultimately, the following order was passed by the Permanent Lok Adalat on 9.11.2015:-

"Statements of the parties have been recorded separately. In view of the statements of the parties this application is dismissed as withdrawn. The parties shall be bound by their statements. File be consigned to record."

On a pointed query put to the counsel for the petitioner as to why he has challenged the order by which the application filed by respondent No.2 has been withdrawn, it is submitted that respondent No.2 has now filed an execution for implementation of the order dated 9.11.2015. In case, the petitioner is aggrieved against the execution, he has a remedy to contest the same before the Permanent Lok Adalat but insofar as the present petition is concerned, it does not require any interference.

Faced with these observations, learned counsel for the petitioner prays for withdrawal of the petition.

Dismissed as withdrawn.
