RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (Oral)

Learned counsel for Union of India, at the very outset, submits that needful has already been done, by granting renewal for practice as Notary to the petitioner. He further submits that petitioner is to deposit requisite amount and the relevant certificate shall be issued in his favour.

Faced with the above, learned counsel for the petitioner also fairly states that petitioner shall deposit the requisite amount within a period of three weeks from today and the present writ petition may be disposed of, directing the competent authority to issue order of renewal for practice as Notary to the petitioner, immediately thereafter.

In view of the above-said stand taken by the learned counsel for the partes, the instant writ petition is disposed of, with liberty to the petitioner to deposit the requisite amount with the competent authority within a period of three weeks from today, as undertaken on his behalf. After deposit of requisite amount by the petitioner, competent authority shall issue the renewal for the practice as Notary in favour of the petitioner without any further loss of time and in any case within a period of three weeks thereafter.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the present writ petition stands disposed of, however, with no order as to costs.
