The petitioner is working as Driver with the Municipal Council, Maur (respondent No.3) and is seeking a direction to respondent No.3 to pay the arrears of salary, as also to deposit the arrears of provident fund etc.

The case of the petitioner is that respondent No.3-M.C. has not paid salary of five months to him, as also not deposited provident fund etc. in his account.

On the previous date i.e. 06.12.2016, the following order was passed:-

“ *Learned Counsel for contesting respondent No.3 states that the present writ petition has become infructuous, however, prays for time to file an affidavit to that effect.*

In compliance of the aforesaid order, learned Counsel for the contesting respondent No.3-M.C. has filed an affidavit dated 14.12.2016 of Sh. Ashok Arora, Executive Officer, Municipal Council, Maur, the same is taken on record. Copy of the same has been supplied to learned opposite Counsel.

In the reply, it is stated that the due salaries along with arrears of provident fund etc. have been released/deposited. Along with reply, copies of the cheques along with the details have also been enclosed as **Annexure R-3/1 (collectively)**.

Learned Counsel for the parties are agreed that the present petition has become infructuous.

In view of the above, the present petition is dismissed as infructuous.
