Petitioner seeks the relief of regularization w.e.f. 23.08.2014, i.e., the date when similarly placed employees including his juniors were regularized, vide notification dated 18.06.2014 (Annexure P2). Resultantly, the petitioner also prays for release of the financial benefits along with interest, for the delayed consideration.

It is the case of the petitioner that he was appointed as Tubewell Helper on 20.05.1994, with the respondent-Corporation and he has been continuously working without any break. In pursuance of the above-said notification (Annexure P2) certain conditions were there for regularizing the Group C & D employees and the petitioner was eligible for regularization. However, he was wrongly shown as 8th fail, due to which, the benefit was not granted to him. Thereafter, he submitted representations dated 07.10.2014 (Annexure P4) and 16.11.2015 (Annexure P5) to respondent No.2, for redressal of his grievances.

Counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner would be satisfied if a time-bound direction is issued to take a decision on the representations filed by the petitioner.

Notice of motion.

Mr.Saurabh Girdhar AAG, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of respondent No.1. Copy of the paperbook has been supplied to him.

Keeping in view the limited relief sought, this Court does not feel it necessary to ask the respondents to file reply.

Accordingly, without commenting upon the merits of the case, the present writ petition is disposed of, with a direction to respondent No.2 to decide the representations dated 07.10.2014 (Annexure P4) and 16.11.2015 (Annexure P5), within a period of 3 months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order. In case the benefits are to be denied, a speaking order be passed and the same be conveyed to the petitioner.
