1. This petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking issuance of a writ of certiorari for quashing the notification No. S.O.130(E) dated 17.01.2014 (Annexure P-1) and notification No. S.O.2433(E) dated 18.09.2014 (Annexure P-4) and further a writ of mandamus directing the respondents to release the land of the petitioner.

2. On the last date of hearing on 28.03.2016, an affidavit of the petitioner had been filed wherein it was stated that notification for acquisition of land is not being assailed whereas the award of compensation to the petitioner is challenged as per the provisions of Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013 (*in short* 'the 2013 Act'). The petitioner has confined the prayer in the writ petition to the quantum of compensation only.

3. After arguing for sometime, learned counsel for the

petitioner submitted that the writ petition may be disposed of by permitting the petitioner to file a detailed and comprehensive representation laying claim for compensation under the provisions of the 2013 Act. However, a prayer was made that a direction be issued to the respondents to decide the same expeditiously.

4. In view of above, the writ petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to file a detailed and comprehensive representation before the respondents within one month from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order. It is directed that in case any such representation is filed by the petitioner before the respondents, the same shall be decided by the concerned Authority within two months from the date of its filing by passing a speaking order and after affording an opportunity of hearing to the petitioner in accordance with law.
