The instant petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of Constitution of India for issuance of a writ of mandamus, directing respondents No. 3 and 4 to vacate the house and shops of the petitioners and further directing respondent No. 2 to protect life and liberty of the petitioners at the hands of respondents No. 3 and 4.

Counsel for the petitioners submits that he has moved representation/complaint dated 11.02.2016 (Annexure P-1) to the District Magistrate, Gurdaspur-respondent No.2 but till date even notice of the representation has not been issued to respondents No. 3 and 4. Learned counsel prays that direction may be issued to respondent No. 2 to consider and decide the representation (Annexure P-1) within stipulated period.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioners and after perusing the paper-book, however, without commenting on merits of the case, instant petition is disposed of, without issuing notice to the respondents, with a direction to respondent No. 2 to take

a decision on the representation dated 11.02.2016 (Annexure P-1) as per provisions of the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007, as early as possible, after effecting service upon affected parties, in accordance with law.
