Both the parties along with their respective counsel are present today. They suffered statements in the shape of affidavits during first motion on 14.09.2015. The matter was posted today for second motion. The parties have reiterated their stand taken during first motion.

Both the parties have satisfactorily sworn affidavits before the Court that they have lived separately for more than one year prior to the filing of the joint petition for divorce under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act seeking divorce by mutual consent. They have agreed to dissolve their marriage by mutual consent. They have also demonstrated that they are not in a position to live together as husband and wife. We are satisfied that the averment made in the joint petition are true. In terms of the compromise arrived at between them, the appellant has paid a sum of Rs.15,00,000/- towards present, past and future permanent alimony. They have also agreed that the minor son aged eight years shall be in the custody

of respondent. In view of the above, a decree of divorce by mutual consent dissolving their marriage is granted. Joint petition is accordingly allowed. Decree sheet be prepared.
