Instant writ petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for quashing the orders dated 18.07.2014 (Annexure P-6) and 19.03.2015 (Annexure P-7) the date of order is alleged to be inadvertently mentioned as 19.03.2014 in Annexure P-7, passed by the respondents whereby Sarpanch, Gram Panchayat Bariyawas, Rewari has been directed to deposit the amount shown in excess of actual amount of expenses incurred in construction of street, in the panchayat fund and has been handed over a warning to be careful in future by respondent No.2 vide order dated 18.07.2014 for the irregularities committed by her.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the record.

The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the authorities have not passed the orders as per provisions of the Haryana Panchayati Raj Act (hereinafter in short the Act).

Be that as it may, the fact remains that the authorities have considered the case on merit. The appellate authority as well as the revisional authority under Section 51(5) of the Act have passed the impugned orders on merits after appreciating the material on record and issued direction to the petitioner to make the payment of the amount, as stated earlier, in panchayat fund. In view of the findings of fact recorded by the authorities below, this Court is not inclined to interfere in the matter.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner makes a prayer that the petitioner has other remedies including filing of criminal complaint and he may be permitted to avail the same.

Dismissed.

However, the petitioner will be at liberty to avail any other remedy as available to him including civil and criminal, if any available to him, in accordance with law.
