The instant petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus, directing respondents No. 2 and 3 to follow the procedure as laid down by the Government to uproot the electricity meter and further directing respondents No. 2 and 3 to decide the representation dated 15.03.2016 (Annexure P-2) and dated 28.03.2016 (Annexure P-3).

The instant petition is apparently frivolous. The pleadings are lacking in many aspects. It has not even been averred in the petition that the petitioners were having any particular electricity connections, for which the electricity meters have been issued by the respondents. Even in the representations (Annexures P-2 and P-3), no electricity connection number has been mentioned. This Court is not required to make fishing inquiry on the basis of bald averments, Direction cannot be issued to the authorities to decide the

representations Annexure P-2 and P-3 because these do not disclose any electricity connection issued to any of the applicants.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioners regrets for the serious lapses in the pleadings in the writ petition and prays that he may be permitted to withdraw the present petition.

Dismissed as withdrawn.
