Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioners have approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of certiorari/mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that he does not intend to press this writ petition for the writ in the nature of certiorari, for the time being. However, he submits that the petitioners will be satisfied in case respondent No.4 is directed to consider and decide their representation dated 16.12.2015 (Annexure P-5), within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the present writ petition is disposed of, with a direction to the District Magistrate, Ludhiana-respondent No.4, to look into the matter, consider the grievance of the petitioners raised vide their representation dated 16.12.2015 (Annexure P-5) and decide the same at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the instant writ petition stands disposed of.
