The instant writ petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari for setting aside the order dated 11.01.2016 (Annexure P-10) passed by respondent No.3- Chairman, Permanent Lok Adalat (Public Utility Services), Chandigarh.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and perused the paper-book.

The authority (Permanent Lok Adalat (Public Utility Services), Chandigarh) has come to a conclusion that at the time when the application forms were distributed to the residents, the same was not received by the petitioner. Form -A is the prerequisite of the Scheme for allotment. The petitioner has himself admitted that he had gone to his native village when the forms were supplied. The petitioner can now approach the U.T., Administration for supply of the form-A and if he is entitled, then his case shall be considered in

accordance with law.
