M. JEYAPPAUL, J.

Petitioner No.1 Anoop Kumra and petitioner No.2 Nisha were present today. They suffered individual affidavits. They submitted that the affidavits individually suffered by them may be treated as their statements in second motion.

During second motion, they submitted that they have compromised the matrimonial dispute. They were not able to live together as husband and wife and therefore, they have mutually agreed that the marriage between them should be dissolved. The averments in the joint petition and the affidavits suffered by them are found to be true.

In terms of the compromise, 2nd petitioner Nisha has received a sum of Rs.4,00,000/- in aggregate from petitioner No.1 Anoop Kumra towards permanent alimony. The 2nd petitioner Nisha has undertaken to

withdraw not only the contempt petition she has filed before the High Court but also the petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure filed by her against petitioner No.1 Anoop Kumra. 2nd petitioner shall abide by the above statement.

In view of the above, a decree for divorce dissolving their marriage by mutual consent with effect from the date of decree is granted. Petition is accordingly ordered. Decree sheet be prepared.
