Applicant seeks condonation of delay of 1562 days in filing the appeal.

On asking of the Court, Mr. Arun Beniwal, DAG, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3.

After hearing the learned counsel for the parties, instant application is allowed, for the reasons stated therein. Delay of 1562 days in filing the appeal is condoned. However, in view of the law laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Imrat Lal and others Vs. Land Acquisition**

Collector and others, 2015 (2) RCR (Civil) 437, the applicant-appellant shall not be entitled for interest for this period of delay of 1562 days.
