RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (ORAL)

Applicant-wife, by way of instant application under Section 24 of the Code of Civil Procedure, seeks transfer of a divorce petition filed by the respondent-husband from Bathinda to Barnala.

Notice of motion was issued and pursuant thereto, respondent-husband has filed the reply by way of CM No.9288-CII of 2016, which stands allowed. Copy of the reply has been supplied to learned counsel for the applicant.

Heard learned counsel for the parties.

It has gone undisputed before this Court that there is a child out of this wedlock. Applicant-wife, along with her minor child, is living with

her parents in her ancestral village in District Barnala. Respondent-husband is serving at Barnala. Other litigations between the parties are also pending at Barnala. Distance between Bathinda and Barnala is about 60 kilometers.

In view of the abovesaid undisputed fact situation obtaining in the present case, this Court is of the considered opinion that the present transfer application deserves to be allowed. It is so said because responsibility of the wife for bringing up the children, pendency of other litigations between the parties and distance between two places, besides the convenience of the wife, are some of the relevant considerations for deciding the transfer applications, like the present one.

The abovesaid view taken by this Court also finds support from the order dated 16.03.2016 passed by this Court in TA No.945 of 2015 (Sushma and others Vs. Kapil @ Sahil Bansal), which, in turn, was based on the judgments of the Hon'ble Supreme Court, as well as different High Courts, including this Court.

Considering the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case noted above, coupled with the reasons aforementioned, this Court is of the considered view that instant transfer application deserves to be accepted and the same is hereby allowed. Divorce petition titled as Paramvir Singh Vs. Sarabjeet Kaur filed by the respondent-husband, is ordered to be transferred from Bathinda to Barnala.

Accordingly, learned District Judge, Bathinda is directed to send the complete record of the abovesaid divorce petition, to the learned District Judge, Barnala at an early date and in any case within a period of one month from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

Learned District Judge, Barnala is also directed either to decide the case himself or assign it to the learned Court of competent jurisdiction for its early decision, in accordance with law.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, instant transfer application stands disposed of, however, with no order as to costs.
