GIAN DEI & ANR V/S STATE OF HARYANA & ORS

On 08.09.2014, following order was passed by this Court:-

“This is a petition seeking protection of life and liberty of petitioner from respondents No.4 to 6.

On 28.08.2014 following order was passed by this Court: -

“Instant petition has been filed seeking protection of life and liberty of the petitioners from respondents No. 4 to 6. The petitioners assert that they are major and as there is no legal impediment, they have got married. They have already moved representation dated 27.08.2014 (Annexure P-4) to respondent no.2 – Superintendent of Police, District Mewat at Nuh, for protecting their life and liberty.

Learned counsel for the petitioners, after seeking instructions from petitioner no.2 states that in order to show his bonafide, petitioner no.2 will deposit a sum of Rs. 1,00,000/- in the form of FDR for three years in favour of petitioner no.1. Initially, petitioner no.2 will deposit a sum of Rs. 50,000/- in the form of FDR for three years in favour of petitioner no.2 within 2-3 days and thereafter Rs.50,000/- within six months in the form of FDR for three years. An affidavit of petitioner no.2 with regard to deposit of Rs.1,00,000/- in the form of FDR has been filed in Court which is taken on record.

Notice of motion for 08.09.2014.

Respondent No.3 – Station House Officer, Police Station Nuh, District Mewat is directed to effect service upon private respondent Nos. 4 to 6. However, the SHO will ensure that no inconvenience and embarrassment is caused to them and for that purpose, official going for service may prefer ably be in civil uniform.

In the meantime, liberty is granted to the petitioners to approach respondent No.2 – Superintendent of Police, District Mewat at Nuh for protection, as per instructions dated 21.02.2011 issued by the Home Department, Haryana. Petitioners may not be arrested and adequate

security be provided to them, if required.”

In part compliance of the order dated 28.08.2014, petitioner No.2 has produced an FDR amounting to ₹ 50,000/- in favour of petitioner No.1 for three years, a photocopy whereof is taken on record.

In view of this, present petition is disposed of and the order dated 28.08.2014 is made absolute.

Petitioner no.1 will intimate this Court about deposit of remaining amount of ₹ 50,000/- by petitioner no.2 as aforesaid along with a photocopy of the FDR.”

Neither the parties are coming forward, nor the counsel has come present. It appears that the parties have lost interest in the matter. There is no information or instructions with regard to compliance of order dated 08.09.2014.

Accordingly, the matter is disposed of with liberty to the aggrieved party to revive the same within six weeks from today.

A copy of this order be sent to petitioner No.1.
