

## MANDEEP KAUR &amp; ANR V/S STATE OF PUNJAB &amp; ORS

Present : None for the petitioner (s).

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On the last date of hearing, none caused representation on behalf of the petitioners. Today as well, none has caused appearance despite information to the counsel.

On 01.09.2014, following order was passed by this Court:-

*“This is a petition seeking protection of life and liberty of the petitioners from respondents no.4 to 6.*

*On 14.08.2014, following order was passed by this Court:*

*“Instant petition has been filed seeking protection of life and liberty of the petitioners from respondents No.4 to 6. The petitioners assert that they are major and as there is no legal impediment, they have got married. They have already moved representation dated 13.08.2014 (Annexure P-5) to respondent No.2- Senior Superintendent of Police, Police District Batala for protecting their life and liberty.*

*Learned counsel for the petitioners, after seeking instructions from petitioner no.2 states that in order to show his bonafide, petitioner no.2 will deposit a sum of Rs.2,00,000/- in the form of FDR for three years in favour of petitioner No.1. Initially, petitioner no.2 will deposit a sum of Rs.1,00,000/- in the form of FDR for three years in favour of petitioner no.1 by the adjourned date and thereafter Rs.1,00,000/- within three months in the form of FDR for three years. Affidavit of petitioner no.2 to the above effect, filed in Court, is taken on record.*

*Notice of motion for 21.08.2014.*

*Respondent No.3- Station House Officer, PS Ghoman, Tehsil Batala, District Gurdaspur is directed to effect service upon private respondent Nos.4 to 6. However, the SHO will ensure that no inconvenience and embarrassment is caused to them and for that purpose, official going for service may preferably be in civil uniform.*

*In the meantime, liberty is granted to the petitioners to approach no.2- Senior Superintendent of Police, Police District Batala, for protection, as per instructions dated 18.08.2010 issued by the Home Department, Punjab. Petitioners may not be arrested and adequate security be provided to them, if required."*

*On 21.08.2014, following order was passed by this Court.*

*"Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that in part compliance of order dated 14.08.2014, petitioner No.2 has deposited Rs.85,000/- in FDR in favour of petitioner No.1 and seeks ten days' time to deposit remaining amount of Rs.15,000/-. Photocopy of FDR is taken on record. It is further submitted that there is possibility of amicable settlement and performance of customary marriage between the petitioners.*

*Adjourned to 1.9.2014.*

*Parties shall remain present in Court on the adjourned date."*

*Learned counsel for the petitioners states that petitioner no.2 has deposited the amount of Rs.85,000/- vide receipt dated 20.08.2014 and Rs.1 lac vide receipt dated 30.08.2014 in the form of FDR for three years in favour of petitioner no.1 and will deposit the remaining amount of Rs.15,000/- in the form of FDR for three years in favour of petitioner no.1. A photocopy of receipt dated 30.08.2014, filed in Court, is taken on record. Learned State counsel, after seeking instructions from the police official present in Court submits that the petitioners have performed marriage as per Sikh rites and ceremonies.*

*Keeping in view the above, order dated 14.08.2014 is made absolute.*

*Disposed of.*

*However, petitioners will supply a photocopy of FDR of remaining amount of Rs.15,000/- within three months to this Court."*

Neither the parties are coming forward, nor the counsel has come present. It appears that the parties have lost interest in the matter.

Accordingly, the matter is disposed of with liberty to the aggrieved party to revive the same within six weeks from today.
