Learned counsel for the petitioner corporation, on instructions, states that
the corporation is agreeable to the following:

- (i) The corporation will permit the respondents to join India Trade Promotion Organization (ITPO).
- (ii) The respondents would be entitled to retain their lien with the Delhi Transport Corporation for a period of one year and on or before the said date, the respondents would submit their technical resignations.
- (iii) Gyan Prakash (respondent in W.P.(C) No.10347/2016 is in occupation of staff quarter. He shall vacate the staff quarter within

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one month from the date he joins ITPO on deputation.

Learned counsel for the respondents, on instructions, states that condition no.(iii) is acceptable to Gyan Prakash. With regard to condition no. (ii), it is submitted that the period of probation has not been specified by the ITPO.

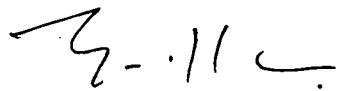
Learned counsel for the respondents states that in case ITPO want to extend the period of probation beyond one year, the respondents will approach the petitioner corporation for appropriate orders.

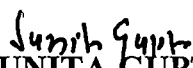
Learned counsel for the petitioner corporation on instructions from Mr S. Chandra, Depot Manager, has accepted the said suggestion.
