CRL.M.C. 4852/2016

This is a petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No. 690/2016, under Sections 354A/506/34 IPC, registered at Police Station- Safdarjung Enclave, New Delhi and all proceedings emanating therefrom.

Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is working as Principal at St.Paul School, Hauz Khas, New Delhi and the complainant was working as PRT in the aforesaid school. He has submitted that due to misunderstanding between the parties, the complainant lodged FIR No. 690/2016, under Sections 354A/506/34 IPC at Police Station- Safdarjung, New Delhi. He has further submitted that after registration of the FIR qua the petitioner, the relatives and the friends intervened and the matter has been settled between the parties. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that all disputes have been amicably settled between the parties and

nothing remains to be adjudicated upon further and submits that the FIR in question is coming as hurdle in the way of the present petitioners. He further submits that the petitioner and the respondent No.2 want to lead peaceful life in near future and since all disputes have been settled between them, the FIR in question and all proceedings arising therefrom may be quashed.

The respondent No.2/complainant is present in Court today and has been identified by her counsel as well as by the Investigating Officer, WSI Sonam, P.S. Safdarjung Enclave, Delhi. The respondent No.2/complainant also admits that the matter has been amicably settled with the petitioner vide settlement deed dated 17th December, 2016 and has no claim or grievance left against the petitioner. She further submits that the settlement/compromise has taken place voluntarily, without any force, pressure or coercion. She further submits that he has no objection if the FIR in question is quashed.

Looking into the above facts and circumstances, since the matter has been amicably settled between the parties and nothing remains to be adjudicated further and in order to maintain good relations and harmony amongst the parties, I deem it appropriate to quash the FIR No. 690/2016, under Sections 354A/506/34 IPC, registered at Police Station-Safdarjung, New Delhi, and all proceedings emanating therefrom.

The present petition is disposed of accordingly.
