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Learned counsel for the complainant states that the matter has been settled with the petitioner as well and besides receiving a sum of ₹4 lakhs from the petitioner he has also received a further sum of ₹30,000/- today in Court by way of demand draft No.'006249' drawn on IDBI Bank.

Learned counsel for the complainant on instructions from the complainant who is present in Court states that he has no objection if the petitioner is granted anticipatory bail and that the complainant will give his no objection to the quashing of the FIR.
