ORAL ORDER

2 19-12-2017 This writ petition has been filed for release of a vehicle (Motorcycle) bearing Registration No. BR06AP/4756, which has been seized in connection with Sursand P.S. Case No.52/17 due to violation of the Excise Act. The prayer made in the writ petition is to release the vehicle in question pending finalization of the confiscation proceedings and/or criminal case.

It is common ground that in various cases, identical in nature, pending finalization of the confiscation proceedings vehicles have been directed to be released by this Court on



various conditions and we see no reason to make a deviation in the present case.

Keeping in view the aforesaid, it is directed that pending finalization of the aforesaid confiscation proceedings and/or criminal case, the aforesaid vehicle in question shall be released to the petitioner on his furnishing two surety bonds to the satisfaction of Collector-cum-District Magistrate, Sitamarhi and further undertaking to produce the vehicle as and when directed by the Collector-cum-District Magistrate, Sitamarhi and not to alienate or deal with the vehicle in question during the pendency of the confiscation proceedings and/or criminal case in any manner so as to create third party interest or cause prejudice to the rights of the State Government in the confiscation proceedings and/or criminal case.

With the aforesaid, the writ petition stands allowed and disposed of.
