ORAL ORDER

3 09-11-2017 A cost of Rs.15,000/- is imposed on the Vice Chancellor as well as the Registrar of the University because they have failed to file counter affidavit and render assistance for adjudication despite the writ application having been filed way back on 16.06.2016. The cost will be payable to the petitioner for his harassment, which will be payable jointly by the Vice Chancellor and the Registrar from their pocket and not from the University fund.

Writ is disposed off putting the burden upon the Vice Chancellor of the University now that he will decide the grievance of the petitioner with regard to revision and re-



fixation of his pension and payment of arrear in view of the notification dated 29th July, 2010 notified by the State Government fixing the new pay scale to make them at par with 6th Pay Revision Committee recommendation made available to the State Government employees. The decision must be taken and communicated to the petitioner, if not grievance redressed, if entitled, within a period of three months from the date of filing of application with a copy of this order. This order has been passed in the light that no counter affidavit has been filed which could have assisted the Court in adjudication.

Writ stands disposed off.
