ORAL ORDER

8 22-03-2017 The petitioner and Opposite party No.2 are wife and husband. Seeing the nature of dispute between them, the matter was referred to Patna High Court Mediation Centre for resolution of the dispute through negotiated settlement between them.

Learned Mediator has submitted his report, which is at Flag-Z, from which it appears that the parties have resolved their dispute on following terms and conditions:-

“1. Both the husband and wife have decided and have agreed to restore their conjugal life and have agreed to live together with their twin children aged 6 ½ years.

2. The husband has agreed to keep his wife and children in his paternal house at Ishalampur (West Bengal).

3. Both the husband and wife have agreed to live together with the respect of dignity of each other and their family members.

4. The Opposite party (the husband) has agreed that in compliance of Court's order whatever the amount is due to him he will deposit the same in fixed deposit in favour of their children.

5. The parties have further agreed that they will take steps to withdraw all the cases filed against each other before all the



forms.

6. It has further been agreed upon between the parties that if either of the party violates the terms and conditions of this compromise then the other side will be at liberty to take legal recourse against such violation of terms and conditions.

7. That the above contents of this agreement have been read over and explained to us in Hindi in presence of our respective lawyer which we have full understood and accepted there upon.

8. That in the above terms and conditions a settlement has been arrived at between the parties and both have signed/thumb impression in presence of their respective learned counsel, who have also put their signature on this agreement.”

This application is, accordingly, disposed of in view of

the agreed negotiated settlement between the parties, as noted

above.
