A.P.P. for the State.

The petitioner apprehends his arrest in connection with
Barari P.S. Case no. 348 of 2016, registered under Sections 341, 323,
379, 307, 504 & 506/34 of the Indian Penal Code.

In paragraph No.3 of the petition, the petitioner has stated
that there is no criminal antecedent except Complaint Case No. 1711
of 2013 between the same party and the petitioner along with 17
others, who have been made accused and they have been granted bail
in the said case. In para-06 of the petition, it has been mentioned that
there is land dispute between the parties and there is also a counter
case bearing Barari P.S. Case No. 353 of 2016 between the parties
arising out of the land dispute. Learned counsel for the petitioner has
relied upon Annexure-05 i.e. Injury Report, the injury found on the
person of the informant is simple in nature.



Having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case, let the above named petitioner, be released on bail, in the event of his arrest or surrender before the learned Court below within a period of four weeks from the receipt/production of the order, on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the A.C.J.M.5th, Katihar in connection with Barari P.S. Case No. 348 of 2016, subject to the condition as laid down under Section 438 (2) of the Cr.P.C.
