The challenge in the present Letters Patent Appeal is to an order passed by a learned Single Bench of this Court on 08.09.2015 whereby the writ application filed by the appellant was dismissed.

The appellant claims that the grants-in-aid given by the State for the 2459 Madarsa is not being disbursed to the genuine



Madarsas but to fake Madarsas. The appellant claims to be a teacher in one of the Madarsas.

If the genuine Madarsas are not being paid grants-in-aid, the cause of action is to the said genuine Madarsas and not to the appellant who is only a teacher in one of the Madarsas.

The Letters Patent Appeal is, thus, dismissed.
