Only 38 years have gone past since the bread-
earner i.e. the father of the present appellant died. High sounding
submission made by the counsel that the appellant cannot be made
to suffer because there was delay on the part of the respondents to
consider his case within time may sound good as a proposition of
law, but when applied to facts the very object of providing
compassionate appointment has been lost because the family has



survived for 38 years without the bread-earner.

Appeal is dismissed.
