learned Additional Solicitor General for the Union of India.

The order of the Central Administrative Tribunal,
Patna Bench, Patna (hereinafter referred to as the “Tribunal”)
passed in O.A. No. 375/2015 dated 22.09.2016 does not
require any interference.

The Tribunal has rightly held that the Limited
Transfer Facility is not meant for transfer from one post to
another in the same Branch Post Office. If the object of filing



such O.A. of the petitioner is to lighten the work load upon herself, she should look for alternative employment and not innovate.

The Writ Application is dismissed.
