7 13-07-2017 Heard learned counsel for the parties.

This application for anticipatory bail arises out of Sahar P.S. Case No. 56 of 2016, disclosing offences under Sections 494,498A34 of the Indian Penal Code and Sections 3/4 of the Dowry Prohibition Act.

Earlier the matter was sent to the Patna High Court Mediation and Conciliation Centre, despite that the dispute between them could not be resolved amicably.

The petitioner is the husband of Opposite party No.2. It is evident from the materials on record that matrimonial discord between them is the root cause for registration of the First Information Report. No purpose will be served, if the petitioner is taken into custody.

It is submitted that the petitioner shall present



himself before the police as and when required and there is no chance that he will tamper with the evidence or influence the witnesses.

Considering the nature of dispute involved and the submissions advanced on behalf of the petitioner, this application is allowed.

Let the petitioner above-named in the event of his arrest/surrender within six weeks from today in the Court below be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/-(ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate-X, Bhojpur at Ara in Sahar P. S. Case No. 56 of 2016, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.

This is subject to the condition that the petitioner shall present himself before the Police/Court, as the case may be, as and when required and in the event of failure on his part to appear before the Court on two consecutive occasions, his bail bonds shall be liable to be cancelled.
