In this case earlier show -cause was filed and lastly
supplementary show-cause has been filed on behalf of the opposite
party no. 2, 3 and 5 wherein it has been indicated that in
compliance with the order of the writ court the case of A.C.P. was



considered and benefit of 2nd A.C.P. has already been granted.

Learned State Counsel in view of the statement made in paragraph no. 4 of the supplementary show -cause has produced two banker's cheque bearing no. 052323 and 052324 for Rs. 5150/- and 10078/- respectively and in presence of the Court he hands over the cheques to Sri Rupak Kumar, learned counsel for the petitioner.
