From the Show Cause filed by the University it is seen that the direction has been complied with by the University as per the requirement of law. Even though the order disposing of the matter, the said dispute cannot be looked into in this contempt application once the University has initiated the process and completed it in accordance with law.

In case the petitioner feels that the process has not been completed in accordance with the requirement of law or the scheme laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court, the petitioner may



challenge the same afresh in accordance with law. The manner in which the process has been completed cannot be further scrutinized in this contempt application.

This contempt application is disposed of with the liberty to the petitioner to challenge the process, as has been done and completed by the university, afresh in accordance with law.
