2 15-11-2017 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and Union of India.

2. In view of the preliminary objection raised by learned counsel for the Union of India that for the relief claimed, the petitioner has first to approach the Central Administrative Tribunal, learned counsel for the petitioner prays that he may be permitted to withdraw the writ petition with liberty to move before the appropriate forum, in accordance with law.
