Heard learned counsel for the petitioners.

The petitioners are apprehending their arrest in connection with Dhansoi P.S. Case No. 164 of 2016 registered for the offences punishable under Sections 304B and 201/34 of the Indian Penal Code.

It has been submitted on behalf of the petitioners that petitioners are mother-in-law and father-in-law of the deceased and there is no specific allegation against them, rather there is general and omnibus allegation of demand of dowry and torture.

Heard learned APP and learned counsel for the informant also, who have opposed the prayer stating that there is allegation against them of demand of dowry and torture and the death is within seven years of marriage but they could not point



out any specific allegation against them.

Having heard both sides and in view of the submission, as stated above, let the petitioners, named above, in the event of their arrest or surrender in the court within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt/production of a copy of this order, be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees twenty five thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate-III, Buxar, in connection with Dhansoi P.S. Case No. 164 of 2016, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure and further conditions that petitioners shall co-operate in the investigation and make themselves available before the police as and when required and in the event of failure on their part to appear before the police on two consecutive dates, the prosecution shall be free to move for cancellation of their bail bonds and further petitioners will not induce any witness or tamper with the evidence.
