ORAL JUDGMENT

Date: 28-02-2017

The writ application filed by the petitioner was disposed of on 13th February, 2012 with liberty to the petitioner to submit a representation to consider the same in accordance with law within two months.

In pursuance of such direction, the University in its show cause dated 20th August, 2012, submitted that a sum of Rs.4,47,723/- is payable to the petitioner towards interest, but such payment shall be made only on receipt of the amount from the State



Government. In another show cause filed today, the stand of the University is that the State Government has declined the request of the University for payment of interest as there is no provision of payment of interest by the State Government. A speaking order dated 30th of September has been attached with the show cause as Annexure-B.

Since an order has been passed declining the claim of the petitioner for payment of interest, the present contempt petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to avail such remedy as is available to the petitioner in accordance with law for redressal of his grievances.
